## Safeguarding Mapping Exercise



The diagram below maps the *National Principles for Child Safe Organisations* against the *QIP Standards for Safeguarding Children and Vulnerable Adults (Pilot Edition)*.

### National Principles for Child Safe Organisations

Principle 1	Child safety and wellbeing is embedded in organisational leadership, governance and culture.
Principle 2	Children and young people are informed about their rights, participate in decisions affecting them and are taken seriously.
Principle 3	Families and communities are informed and involved in promoting child safety and wellbeing.
Principle 4	Equity is upheld and diverse needs respected in policy and practice.
Principle 5	People working with children and young people are suitable and supported to reflect child safety and wellbeing values in practice.
Principle 6	Processes to respond to complaints and concerns are child focused.
Principle 7	Staff and volunteers are equipped with the knowledge, skills and awareness to keep children and young people safe through ongoing education and training.
Principle 8	Physical and online environments promote safety and wellbeing while minimising the opportunity for children and young people to be harmed.
Principle 9	Implementation of the national child safe principles is regularly reviewed and improved.
Principle 10	Policies and procedures document how the organisation is safe for children and young people.
